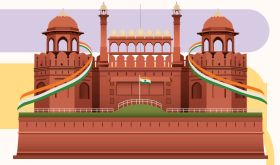

Unity in diversity, pride in our hearts!

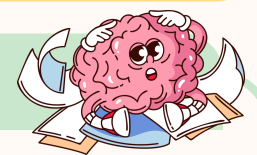

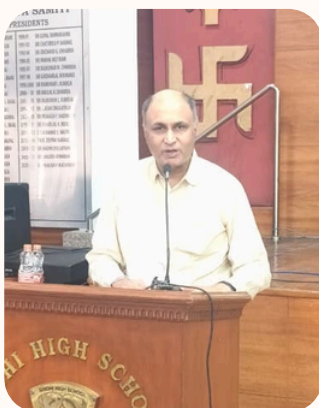
SESSION BY DR. RAJDEEP MANWANI

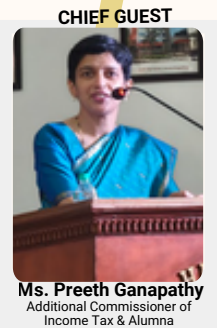


Celebrating milestones and crafting legacies!

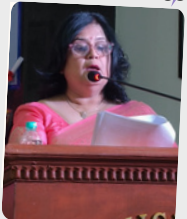

Exploring the frontiers of science!

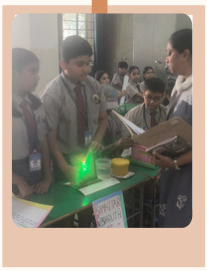

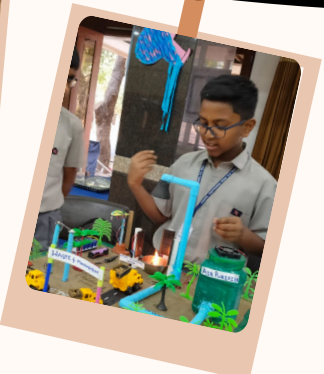
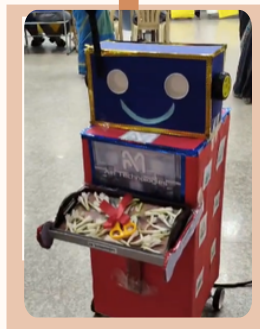
NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY CELEBRATIONS

I wonder if there is anything one cannot find here. From fabrics to spices, woven cloth to glassware and from grains to precious gems all are found.

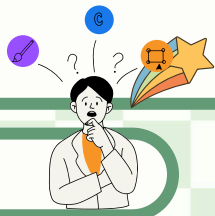
As the market ends, I enter a hotel, drawn in by the aroma of its dishes. A man comes and speaks in a language I do not understand. He tries speaking in two to three other languages hoping I will understand. I struggle to communicate as another local approaches me in Persian. He helps me order and by the time food arrives we have become friends. I start to eat my fish curry and rice and instantly fall in love with it. The fish curry is full of spice and rich flavour sparking a contrast to the mild spiced rice. Our plates are empty within minutes.

We are on our way to the Kadri Manjunath Temple as I observe the street filled with shops selling lamps, flowers and religious goods. We enter the temple as I take in the fragrances of flowers, aroma of food, lamps lit with flames, the detailed pillars, the sounds of pillars and various inscriptions. At the centre there is another building which seems to be the main chamber. Its walls and the high raised pyramid like structure is intricately carved with deities and their stories. A small chamber houses the idol of lord Shiva. I am wandering around the temple awestruck and curious when suddenly my friend tugs me towards an open field out of the temple.

There is a huge crowd huddled together as a man dances in between. I make my way to the front and take in the sight of the man dancing, possessed with the spirit of a God. His face morphs into heavy expressions with ease. He is wearing a red piece of clothing with a skirt made of grass. His attire is adorned with flowers instead of jewels. His face is painted yellow with some red and white. On top of his head sits a towering head dress decorated with flowers. I stand there watching him for another quarter of an hour until the crowd prays to him and leaves. I am speechless as his performance has left me spellbound. My friend nudges me and I snap back to reality. He explains to me about the traditional ritual which just took place. I am now aware it's called "Bhooth Khola".

My friend invites me to his lodge for the night. As we walk to the lodge my mind is flooding with queries. I question him about the exotic cuisines, the diverse cultures, the mesmerizing monuments, the rich tradition, the kingdoms and local people. My friend enthusiastically answers all my questions. He starts to describe about the places he has visited and about Hampi, the capital of the Vijayanagara Empire. His description makes me want to travel more and see more of the culture. As I begin to ask another set of questions the lodge arrives. It's lit with lamps and in the centre is an open area with room along the sides. As he leads me to my room, I take in the building. He assures me that he will answer my question later and tells me to take rest. I thank him and lay on the bed as he leaves. I am exhausted, but my mind is not. I still have so many unanswered questions and desires. I close my eyes and reflect on the day. But at least sleep gets me and I drift off to sleep, wanting to discover more in the coming days about the rich Vijaynagara empire, King Krishnadevaraya and his Ashta diggajas among them the witty TenaliRamaKrishna..

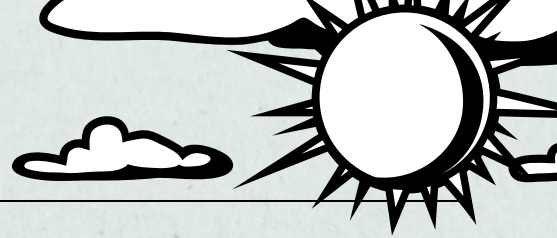

We found a love that filled it all.

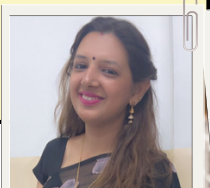
Now days are loud, with crowds and noise,

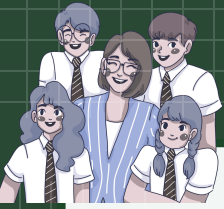
The First shower

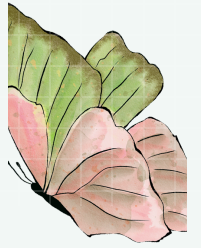


*It was a melee' of personalities,
